Holiday Farm Fire Reforestation (2021- 2024) In September 2020 the Holiday Farm Fire burned 173,393 Acres in my service area. In order to aid small landowners in reforestation efforts, I am collaborating with the local watershed council, water and electric utility, and soil and water conservation district. Landowners are receiving educational resources, planting plans, and seedlings to restore their burned areas.
